Since the City's incorporation, City Council has adopted numerous ordinances, resolutions and policies pertaining to the creation, revision, and dissolution of City Boards and Commissions.

On October 12, 1999, City Council passed and adopted Ordinance No. 624 adding Title 1, Chapter 2.46 to the Brentwood Municipal Code establishing a Park and Recreation Commission.

On July 28, 2009, the City Council adopted Ordinance 873, amending section 2.46.070 (Compensation) of the Brentwood Municipal Code to authorize Park and Recreation Commission Compensation.

On November 10, 2020, the City Council considered an ordinance to, among other things, make the procedural requirements between the commissions, including the Park and Recreation Commission, more uniform and clarify the powers and duties of the commissions. Following discussion the City Council asked for additional revisions to the ordinance pertaining to the Park and Recreation Commission.

On November 17, 2020, the City Council again considered the ordinance, with additional revisions to the Parks and Recreation Commission and Poet Laureate provisions, but declined to move forward with the ordinance at that time.

On September 26, 2023, Council Member Pierson requested a review of the Brentwood Municipal Code sections that are no longer enforceable, including Brentwood Municipal Code 2.46.020, regarding the powers and duties of the Park and Recreation Commission, and any sections of the Municipal Code that are unenforceable.

On October 10, 2023, the City Council concurred with Council Member Pierson's future agenda item request and staff undertook a review of the Park and Recreation Commission ordinance with regard to those powers and duties that are unenforceable.
