On February 26, 2019, The City of Brentwood Parks, Trails & Recreation Master Plan Update was adopted by City Council per Resolution 2019-21.

On February 25, 2020, The City of Brentwood Strategic Plan FY 2020/21-FY 2021/22 was adopted by City Council per Resolution 2020-29.

On July 14, 2020, The City of Brentwood Strategic Plan FY 2020/21-FY 2021/22 was amended by City Council per Resolution 2020-96. The amendment included the Funding Deferred Projects Holding List.

On December 15, 2020, then Council Member Meyer requested a future agenda item requesting the Parks and Recreation Department review how programming serves adults with special needs to improve accessibility.

On January 12, 2021, an agenda item was presented by then Council Member Meyer and there was a consensus of the Council to have staff provide an update on programming for individuals with special needs, including adults.

On February 9, 2021, City Council reviewed the current adaptive recreation programming and restored the adaptive recreation Strategic Plan Initiative and funding to engage a consultant and amend the FY 2020/21 General Fund Operating Budget in an amount not to exceed \$20,000.

On January 24, 2023, the City Council reviewed the Strategic Plan 2022-2024 and requested an update on the Adaptive and Inclusive Recreation Assessment as shared on August 25, 2022 with the Parks & Recreation Commission.

On April 25, 2023, the City Council received and discussed the Adaptive and Inclusive Recreation Assessment from Moore Recreation Therapy & Consulting Inc. and requested Staff bring this item back for further discussion.

On October 10, 2023, the City Council received and discussed the Inclusive and Adaptive Recreation Strategic Initiative Focus 5 Update and requested staff post some local resources on the webpage as well as return with more information on accessibility at Veteran's Park, assess the one acre open space parcel near Pioneer Elementary as a potential All Adaptive Park, and to provide a cost benefit analysis

between hiring someone in-house versus hiring an outside company to provide inclusive and adaptive programming.
